

RESOLUTION 1-2006

OF

**THE BOARD OF THE CECIL TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY
ESTABLISHING THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR INSTALLING
NON-PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY AND DEDUCT WATER METERS**

THIS RESOLUTION SUPERCEDES Resolution 99-5-1 and all amendments to it;

FURTHERMORE, THIS RESOLUTIONS ADOPTS AND INCORPORATES relevant portions of Resolution 5-2-86 (Schedule A) - Unmetered Water Use and its subsequent Amendment at Resolution 8-5-93;

THIS RESOLUTION is made and hereby entered into this 31 day of August, 2006;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of the Cecil Township Municipal Authority, Cecil Township, County of Washington, Pennsylvania as follows:

SECTION 101. When meter usage is used as a basis for a user charge and the user obtains the water used in or on a property from sources other than a public water system, the user shall have the option of installing a water meter on the water supply for the purpose of metering the water for the user charge. The cost of furnishing, installing and maintaining any meters shall be borne by the user. The type, size and location and arrangement of such meters shall be subject to inspection by and approval of the Authority. A list of approved meters will be made available to the user by the Authority. The user must apply for the meter and the application must be accompanied by a sketch showing the plan of the property, the water supply, the water distribution system, the sewer layout, and the location of the proposed meter. All maintenance and/or replacement of said meter shall be borne by the user. The option taken to install such a meter on a property is final and not subject to further options. All meters installed under this section shall include an exterior mount remote unit for meter reading purposes. The Authority shall affix their seal to each unit.

SECTION 102. When metered water usage is used as a basis for user charge and it is established to the satisfaction of the Authority that a portion of the water used in or on any property does not and cannot enter the sanitary sewer system, the Authority may permit through application, the installation of an additional meter(s) to determine the quantity of water excluded from the sanitary sewer system. The type, size and arrangement of such meter(s) shall be subject to inspection by and approval of the Authority. A list of approved meters will be made available to the user by the Authority. The application for a meter must be accompanied by a sketched plan of the property, the water distribution system, the sewer layout, existing meters, and the proposed changes in the water distribution system to accommodate the new meter, and the location of the new meter. All meters installed under this section shall include an exterior mounted remote unit for meter reading purposes. The Authority shall affix their seal to each unit.

SECTION 103. The Authority will read all meters installed under Section 101 quarterly at no direct cost to the user.

SECTION 104. The Authority will read all meters installed under Section 102 yearly unless requested in writing by the customer for additional readings. In the event there is a credit due on an account, a check will be mailed to the address provided by the user. A fee of \$25.00 per meter shall be charged for each residential customer reading and a fee of \$40.00 per meter shall be charged for each commercial customer reading. The Authority will issue a check once per year payable to the customer for the value of recorded usage less the fees stated above.

Section 105. In accordance with Resolution 5-2-86 (Schedule A) - Unmetered Water Use and its subsequent Amendment at Resolution 8-5-93, properties supplementing metered water use from other unmetered sources will be billed in accordance with the referenced schedules for the metered water use (if any) and for an additional estimated quantity of 3,000 gallons per month for the unmetered source used when supplementing metered water usage and for an estimated quantity of 4,000 gallons per month where unmetered water only is used.


SECTION 106. The Authority reserves the right to inspect all meters, as they deem necessary.
